Genesis 18

Genesis 18:1-15

The Lord appeared to Abraham near the great trees of Mamre while he was sitting at the entrance to his tent in the heat of the day.

Abraham looked up and saw three men standing nearby. When he saw them he hurried from the entrance of his tent to meet them and <u>bowed low to the ground</u> He said "if I have found favor in your eyes <u>my Lord</u> do not pass <u>your servant</u> by.

Let a little water be brought and then you may all <u>wash your feet</u> and rest under this tree.

Let me get you something to eat, so you can be refreshed and then go on your way - now that you have come to your servant.

"Very well," they answered "do as you say".

So Abraham <u>hurried</u> into the tent to Sarah..... Then he <u>ran</u> to the herd and selected a choice tender calf and gave it to a servant who <u>hurried</u> to prepare it.

➤ He then brought some <u>curds and milk</u> and the <u>calf</u> that had been prepared and set these before them. While they ate, <u>he stood</u> near them under a tree. Where is your wife Sarah ? they asked him. "There in the tent" he said.

➤ Then the Lord said "I will surely <u>return</u> you about this time next year, and Sarah your wife will have a son".

Now Sarah was listening at the <u>entrance</u> of the tent, which was behind him. Abraham and Sarah were already old and well advanced in years and Sarah was past the age of childbearing.

So Sarah <u>laughed to herself</u> and she thought "after I am worn out and my master is old will I now have this pleasure?" Then <u>The Lord said</u> to Abraham "Why did Sarah <u>laugh</u> and say will I really have a child now that I am old. <u>Is anything too</u> <u>hard for the Lord?</u>

➢ <u>I will return</u> to you at the appointed time next year and Sarah <u>will</u> have a son".

17 Then the Lord said "shall I hide from Abraham what I am about to do?"

Abraham was the friend of God Isaiah
41:8b, II Chronicles 20:7b, James 2:23b
God:

> Talked with His friend

Made covenants with Abraham – for himself, his family, and his descendants 20 Then the Lord said "The outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah is so great and their sins so grievous that I will go down and see if what they have done is as bad as the outcry that has reached me".

>Not a denial of God's infinite knowledge

- The Lord's judgments are well weighedperfectly informed
- A way of saying God is a just judge sees for himself
- >Does not act on accusations of others

22 Then the men turned away and went to Sodom

but Abraham remained standing before The Lord..

Abraham Pleads for Sodom

23 Then Abraham approached him and said "Will you sweep away the righteous with the wicked. What if there are 50 righteous people in the city"? 26 The Lord said if I find 50 righteous people in the city of Sodom I will spare the whole place for their sake.

God:

- Started the conversation
- ➤ Gave Abraham the opportunity to speak –
- > Allowed Abraham to intercede for the righteous people in Sodom and Gomorrah
- Decided when to end the conversation

45 - 40 - 30 - 20 - 10

When the Lord had finished speaking with Abraham - He left

>Abraham returned home

Discussion

➢ If there would have been only 10 righteous people in the city, God would have saved the city. Lot had been in Sodom for many years, yet there were no righteous people in the city.

How many righteous people are in our city?

We are the Salt of the Earth

- For ourselves, our family and our city
- \succ We are the salt for our city
 - Preserves
 - Does not hide or mask

Genesis 19: 1-29

The Visitation of Sodom

The two angels arrived at Sodom in the evening, and lot was sitting in the gateway of the city when he saw them he got up to meet them and bowed down his face to the ground my Lords he said please turn aside to your servants house.

> No they answered we will spend the night in the square but he insisted so strongly that they did go with him and entered his house. He prepared a meal for them baking bread without yeast and they ate.
Before they had gone to bed, all the men from every part of the city of Sodom both young and old surrounded the house. They called him, Lot where are the men who came to you tonight bring them out to us so that we can have sex with them.

Lot went outside to meet them and shut the door behind him and said no my friends don't do this wicked thing. > 9 Get out of our way they replied and they said this fellow came here as an alien and now he wants to play the judge. We'll treat you worse than them. door..

> They kept bringing pressure on Lot and move forward to breakdown the door but the men inside reached out and pulled lot back into the house and shut the door.

Then they struck the men who were at the door of the house young and old with <u>blindness</u> so that they could not find the door..

1. Two angels - not the Lord

In the gate - The usual meeting place for local officials, judges

Lot:

- ➤Was alarmed, he knew the depravity of Sodom. Lot tried to protect the two men
- >Even offers his two daughters
- >Made unleavened bread quick and easy
- The angels had to rescue lot

Sodom and Gomorrah Destroyed

The 2 men said the outcry to the Lord against its people is so great that He has sent us to destroy it.

At dawn, the 2 men led Lot his wife and two daughters to safety out of the city. the Lord was merciful to them. The two men told them not to look back, but lot's wife looked back and turned to a silk pillar of salt.

>Lot and his two daughters fled to Zoar

The Lord rained down burning sulfur on Sodom and Gomorrah

Lot and his daughters left Zoar and lived in a cave

Both daughters got their father drunk and slept with him.

Each had a child

Each Had a Child

- > The oldest daughter how to film son, Moab
- > He became the father of the Moabites
- The younger daughter had a son Ben-Ammi
 - He became the father of the ammonites.
 - Both of these tribes were enemies of Israel

- > Lived with the results of his choices
- Held a position at the city gates (judge) (wealthy)
- Always known as an alien

Lot's Character:

Failure to influence mob

- Failure to influence future sons-inlaws
- Daughters engaged to men of Sodom (not from his own people)

Lot's Wife Influenced by Sodom

≻Remember lot's wife Luke 17:32

>A warning not to linger or look back

Lot's Wife Influenced by Sodom

- A picture of what can happen to those who
 - Turn back
 - Look at sin with longing and desire
 - Not fully committed to God
- ➢ Hebrews 10:38,39 Luke 17:31-33

Chose - His own way

Chose - What he could see

Chose - Live near Sodom - then in Sodom

Results of Lots Choices:

Lived in a house

Prominent man

Sitting in the city gate
Living in a sinful city

Results of Lots Choices:

>Lost his wife to the desires of Sodom

>Lost his daughters to sin and depravity

≻Lost his dignity

≻Lost his wealth

Lost his Godly legacy

Scripture Shows Homosexuality as a Particularly Heinous Sin.

Scripture makes homosexuality a capital of offense - grouped with incest and bestiality

Leviticus 18:22 -30 Do not have sexual relations with a man as one does with a woman that is detestable

Leviticus 20:13 If a man has sexual relations with a man as one does with a woman, both of them have done what is detestable The New Testament is equally appalled with homosexuality

Romans 1:26 - 27 Because of this, God gave them over to shameful lusts even their women exchanged natural sexual relations for unnatural ones.

In the same way the men abandoned natural nations with women and were inflamed with lust for one another. The New Testament is equally appalled with homosexuality

Men committed shameful acts with other men and received in themselves the due penalty for their error. The New Testament is equally appalled with homosexuality

I Corinthians 6:19 Do you not know that your bodies are the temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God/ you are not your own you were bought at a price.

Therefore, honor God with your bodies

Genesis 20

Review:

➢ Genesis 11:27 − 19:29

- 2180 B.C., War- like Barbarians, called Guti conquered Ur.
- Terah had three sons Abram, Haran and Nahor
- Haran died in Ur
- Terah, with his family, Abram and Sari, Nahor, and Haran's son, Lot, (Abram's nephew) leave Ur
 - Headed for Canaan, 1000 miles away.

- Terra and his family stop and settle in Harran, 400 miles from Canaan
- God told Abram to go to Canaan Abram obeyed arrived in Canaan
- Famine Abram and Sarai went to Egypt (lied)
- God restored Abram and Sarai back to Canaan

- Abram and Sari were faithful to God for 10 years
- Sari and Abram decided God could use a slave girl to provide the promised heir
- For 13 years Abram hoped the slave girl's son would be his heir

- 99 years old God made a covenant with Abram - circumcision
- God changed Abram's name to Abraham and Sarai 's name to Sarah
- God announced Sarah would become the mother of Isaac - the long awaited heir
- God saves Abraham's nephew lot

Genesis 20

Abimelech

a Royal Title – Pharoah

Abraham and Sarah moved, and for a while stayed in Gerar

Abraham told Abimelech <u>she is my</u> <u>sister</u>

God came to Abimelech in a dream and said "You are as good as dead, because of the woman you have taken, she is a married woman."
Abimelech had not gone near her, so he said "<u>Lord</u> will you destroy an innocent nation, did he not say "she is my sister"?"

Then God said to him *in a dream* "Yes, I know you did this with a clear conscience... now return the man's wife for <u>he is a</u> <u>prophet</u>, he will <u>pray</u> for you and you will live.

But if you do not return her, you may be sure that you and yours will all die."

> Abimelech called Abraham and said:

"What have you done to us?"

How have I wronged you that you brought such great guilt upon me in my Kingdom?

> What was your reason for doing this?

Abraham Replied:

They will <u>kill me because of my wife she</u>
<u>really is my sister</u>

Solution Additional Additiona

To Sarah he said I am giving your brother 1000 shekels of silver this is to cover the offense against you before all who are with you are completely vindicated

Then <u>Abraham prayed</u> to God, and <u>God</u> <u>healed</u> Abimelech, his wife, his slave girls so they could have children Why did Abimelech desire Sarah as his wife? She was in her 90's

- Does not talk about her beauty
- Secure peace with a wealthy powerful man
- Perhaps combine wealth and/or fighting forces

The pagan people around Abraham believed in prophets

Prophet was associated with magic - not godliness

Believed the gods would reveal their will to the prophet The pagan neighbors did not expect their prophets to be moral

- They did not believe their gods were moral
- The Lord God, Maker of Heaven and Earth

Intended his prophet to be moral -He is moral holy and powerful

Abraham:

- Did not trust God for his safety
- Repeated same sin lying about his wife
- Actions self-serving what will this do for me
- Broken the common laws of hospitality
- Did not ask what will this do to them, or what do they deserve?

Abraham:

- Lied (Omitted truth)
- > Asked Sarah to also lie sin
- Cowardly -Shifted blame
- Did not represent God well!

Abimelech:

- Lavished gifts
- Showed his <u>respect</u> for the power wielded by Abraham
- Recognized his own <u>unintentional</u> error
 Saying ' your brother' emphasized his <u>innocence</u>
- Spoke directly to Sarah <u>– reassured her in</u> public

- Introduction, body, conclusion
- Length: minimum 12 pages
- Double spaced (250 words per page)
